

identity theft

spite of clear danger of it causing death. *Homicidio* is traditionally divided in *homicidio simple* and *homicidio calificado o agravado* on one hand, and in *homicidio intencional* and *homicidio accidental o imprudencial* on the other. The first distinction is based on the gravity of the crime, while the second underlines the presence or absence of criminal intent. Both homicide and *homicidio* are generic terms considered equivalent.

felonious homicide *homicidio sin justificantes*. – Syn. unlawful homicide.

homicide by misadventure *homicidio accidental*. – Syn. accidental killing.

justifiable homicide *homicidio con justificantes*. – Syn. excusable homicide.

negligent homicide *homicidio por negligencia*, [brder]*homicidio culposo*.

premeditated homicide *homicidio premeditado, homicidio con premeditación*.
